
#### Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class

The most valuable aspect of this course would definitely be Jen's teaching and guidance for assignments, openness to help and clarify any questions we had and really expand on topics we saw in class. Using famous examples and clear applications, it made a difference in dissecting a lot of more complex concepts and ideas we discussed.

I really appreaciated the way the discussions were outlined, the whiteboard and the way she linked concepts together was really helpful in understanding how philosophers interact in their academic writings.

Learned useful techniques of analyzing arguments, offering concessions and triangulating with an emphasis on philosophical concepts. Some interesting course material and new perspectives on why conflict happens.

Getting to engage with philosophical concepts in a discussion—manner helped enhance my understanding of each idea, and also introduced me to broader viewpoints that I otherwise would not have considered. #### **ENGAGEMENT ANALYSIS**


#### Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class

You're awesome! Just slow down sometimes






# Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class


# Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class


#### Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class


#### Hours Spent Doing Coursework Outside of Class


#### Hours Spent Doing Coursework Outside of Class
